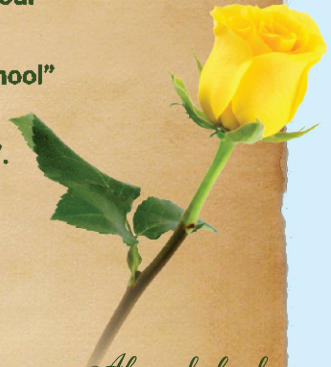

PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE


'Good education is quintessential to a sustainable planet.'

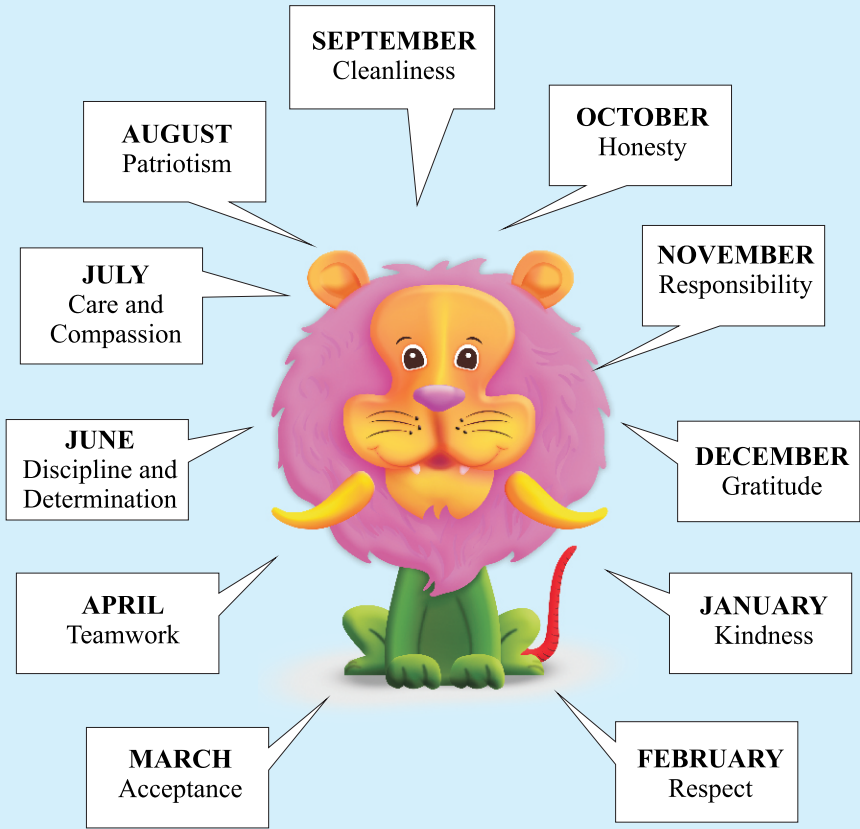

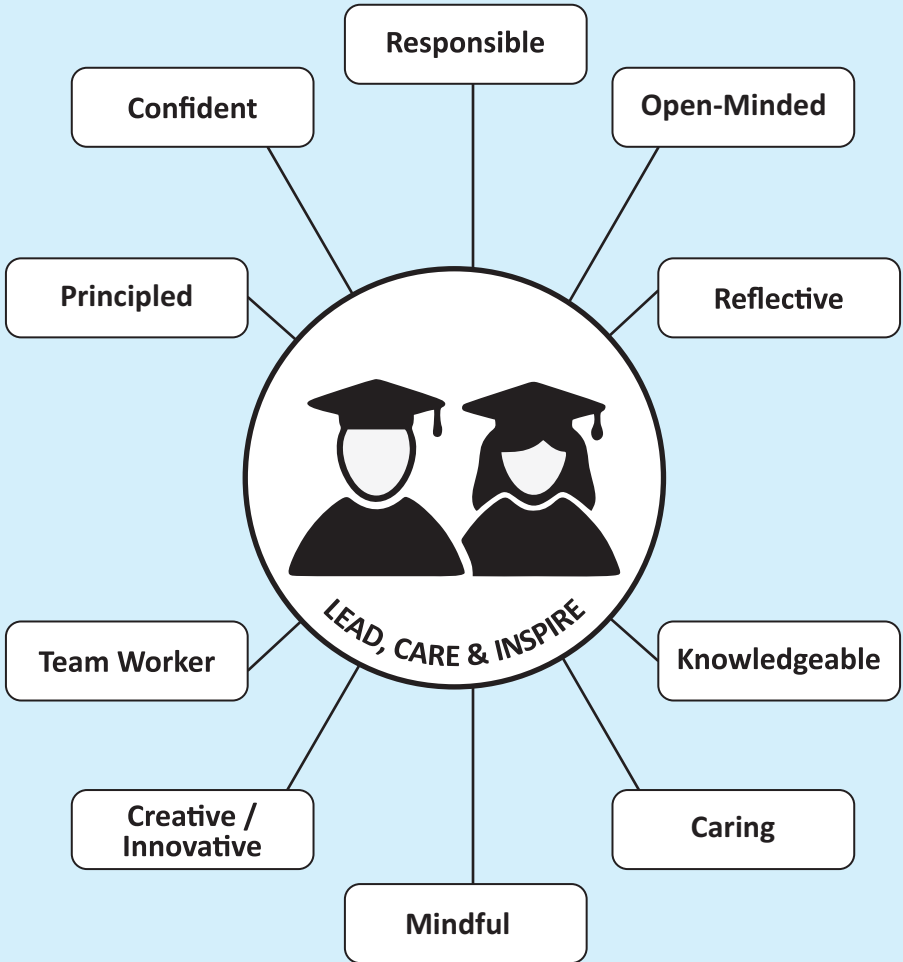

International Year of Plant Health: 2020

The United Nations General Assembly declared 2020 as the International Year of Plant Health (IYPH). The main objective of the program is to raise awareness on how protecting plant health can help reduce hunger, reduce poverty, protect environment and boost economic development.

Plant health is increasingly under threat. Climate change and human activities have altered the ecosystem. This altered ecosystem creates new niches where pests can thrive and consequently affect the ecosystem, directly through the removal of plants providing services, or indirectly through the effects of disease management activities.

New plant pests are relegating the crops around the world, posing greater threat to the food security than ever before. The hazard increases manifold with global trade and changing climate which create favorable conditions for the movement and spread of pests.

Plant pests negatively affect four dimensions of food security

- ❖ Food availability
- ❖ Food access
- ❖ Food utilization
- ❖ Food stability

The three internationally agreed key pillars to tackle outstanding plant pests' challenges include prediction, prevention and protection.

Ecosystem services are the benefits that nature provides to human beings. These services translate the benefits we receive from nature to economic terms and hence we can better understand the trade-off we are making between nature and industrial development.

Hence, we need to understand the key actions essential for reducing anthropogenic environmental footprints:

- Be careful when taking plants and plant product while travelling as it may spread plant pests and diseases.
- Be cautious when ordering plants and plant products online or through postal services as small packages can easily bypass regular phytosanitary controls.
- Spread the word about **PLANT HEALTH** on social media and community throughout 2020.
- Take an action daily to reduce your environmental footprint and actively engage in initiatives to protect and manage natural resources.

Plant health is of global importance for sustainable and competitive agriculture and forestry sectors, as well as for the protection of biodiversity and ecosystems. This year (2020) is a once in a lifetime opportunity to raise global awareness on how protecting plant health can help end hunger, reduce poverty, protect the environment and boost economic development. Thus **we all** need to respect plant health regulations.

LATE ARRIVAL IN SCHOOL

- 1 Parents are requested to drop their wards to school on time.
- 2 The school gate will close at 7:30 am for Senior school and 9:00 am for Primary school.
- 3 In case a student misses a bus he/she cannot board the next bus route.
- 4 Parents are required to fill an undertaking for late arrivals at the entrance at **GATE NO 1**.
- 5 **Three late arrivals** in a month would lead to strict disciplinary action.

ABSENCE FROM SCHOOL

1. There is no provision for half day leave, so students who are not well should not be sent to school even on exam / test days. The student will be marked absent, if he/she were to be taken home by parents / guardians /authorized persons, during school hours, even if it were to be an examination/test days.
2. In case of serious medical condition, students of classes IV to V are exempted from one weekly test in each subject during the academic year.
3. Parents will be promptly informed in the event of serious illness or emergencies and may be requested to come to school to take their ward home.
4. Students who have been sick should bring a medical certificate from their doctor on joining the school. The same should be informed to the school clinic for follow-up.
5. Parents are requested to avoid sending their wards to school in case of any contagious disease for the time period specified below.
 - Measles, Chicken pox : 10 days after appearance of rash or until scabs fall off.
 - Mumps : 15 days
 - Hand foot Mouth Disease : 7 Days
 - Scabies/Conjunctivitis : Till all signs & symptoms disappear.No relaxation will be considered for the above.
6. Parents should fill up the Record of Absence in the Almanac.
7. In case of long period of leave an application signed by the parent should be submitted to the class teacher.
8. In case of repeated/long absence without information, school will take necessary disciplinary action.
9. All students are expected to attend school on the opening day after each break / vacation & for special events.
10. If a student is absent for two consecutive days, or more, he/she should submit a leave application written and signed by his/her parent to the Class Teacher on the day he/she rejoins.

11. (a) It is compulsory for students to complete 75% attendance in the academic year to make them eligible to appear for the final exam.
- (b) No student of class IX/X/XI/XII shall be eligible to take the examination unless he/she has completed 75% of attendance. The session would begin from the commencement of their respective classes, up to the first of the month, preceding the month in which the examination commences, i.e. up to 31st January for Board Classes (CBSE Exam Bye-Laws, Rule No. 13.2).
- (c) 75% attendance is compulsory to be eligible for practicals of Board class XII.

NATIONAL FLAG



The Indian flag was designed as a symbol of freedom. The late Prime Minister Shri. Jawaharwal Nehru called the flag, not only a symbol of freedom for ourselves, but for all people. The flag is a horizontal tricolor, in equal proportion, of deep saffron on the top, white in the middle and dark green at the bottom. The

ratio of the width to the length of the flag is 2:3. In the center of the white band, there is a wheel in navy blue to indicate the Dharma Chakra, the wheel of law in the Sarnath Lion capital. Its diameter approximates the width of the white band and it has 24 spokes. The saffron stands for courage, sacrifice and the spirit of renunciation, the white for purity and truth, the green for faith and fertility.

NATIONAL EMBLEM



National Emblem of India is an adaptation of the Lion Capital of Ashoka from Sarnath, near Varanasi in Uttar Pradesh. The Lion Capital was erected in the third century BC by Emperor Ashoka to mark the spot where Buddha first proclaimed his gospel of peace and emancipation. The National Emblem is thus symbolic of contemporary India's reaffirmation of its ancient commitment to world peace and goodwill. The four lions (one hidden from view) -

symbolizing power, courage and confidence - rest on a circular abacus. The abacus is guarded by four Asiatic lions, guardians of the four directions - The Lion of the North, The Horse of the West, The Bull of The South and The Elephant of the East. The abacus rests on a lotus in full bloom, exemplifying the fountainhead of life and creative inspiration. The motto 'Satyameva Jayate', inscribed below the emblem in Devanagari script, means 'Truth alone triumphs'.

CONTENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM-(CMS) THE INTERACTIVE LEARNING COMMUNITY

In order to 'Go Green' and to connect to the community, DPS-Bopal has introduced CMS. The Interactive Learning community brings students, parents and teachers into one community, enabling each one to share and gather information.

Features :

- Every parent and child gets a unique ID and Password of school portal, which enables one to easily access school information from anywhere
- Parent can access the school's website, notices, school events, assignments, worksheets etc.
- All messages, circulars, alerts and notices are displayed on the school portal. Distribution of printed circulars will be limited. Parents are requested to log on to the school's website on a daily basis, to keep abreast with all the happenings at school.

Digital Boards :

Digital boards are being used in all classes empowering teachers with technology, thereby, enabling them to enhance the teaching learning process.

Various resources like video clippings, digital presentations, images, animation, graphics etc are used to revolutionize the learning process.

HIGHLIGHTS OF PRE SCHOOL

(1) Learning Styles:

In the Pre-Primary section of DPS, all teaching-learning activities are designed on the basis of learning styles of children.

Learning is reflected in the way we respond to our environment [social, emotional and physical] to understand new information. Learning style is the way new information is processed or absorbed.

As with adults, children also have their preferred learning styles and they learn best by using either of their preferred sense i.e. of hearing, seeing or touching.

With this background in mind, students of the Pre-Primary section are identified as lookers (visual), listeners (auditory) and movers (kinesthetic). The concept is based on the book “How to maximize your Child’s Learning Ability” by Dr. Lauren Bradway and Barbara Albers Hill.

The main aim of the programme is to

- Identify the learning style of the child.
- Provide activities according to their learning preference.
- Enhance the other two learning styles other than the preferred one.
- ▼ Not only develops a love for learning but also balances the learning styles for an all round development.

(2) Jolly Phonics:

Jolly Phonics is basically a British programme based on teaching English through synthetic phonic approach. It teaches letter sounds in an enjoyable and multi sensory way. According to Jolly Phonics, there are 42 sounds in English and 26 letters of the alphabet, used to represent sounds. But for reading and writing, the children need to be fluent with the sounds that go with the letters.

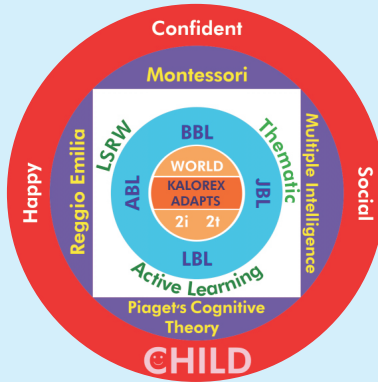
Jolly Phonics targets all kinds of learners in the class i.e. the visual, auditory and kinesthetic learners and the retention is 80% as all the sense organs are engaged in learning.

Our main idea is to generate a successful foundation in the development of a child’s reading and writing skills.

(3) Use of Technology

In order to make learning easier and for concept clarity, power point presentations are used. We have well equipped Tab Lab / Computer Lab as well as Digital Boards for making teaching - learning interesting and interactive.

(4) Methodology of Teaching

We have been inspired by globally accepted teaching methodology - Gardener's Theory of Multiple Intelligences, Reggio Emilia, Piaget's Cognitive Theory and Montessori Method which we incorporate in our teaching.

1. **Gardener's Theory of Multiple Intelligences** proposes eight different intelligences to account for a broader range of human potential in children and adults which are:
 - ▼ **Linguistic Intelligence** ("word smart")
 - ▼ **Logical-Mathematical Intelligence** ("number/reasoning smart")
 - ▼ **Spatial Intelligence** ("picture smart")
 - ▼ **Bodily-Kinesthetic Intelligence** ("body smart")
 - ▼ **Musical Intelligence** ("music smart")
 - ▼ **Interpersonal Intelligence** ("people smart")
 - ▼ **Intrapersonal Intelligence** ("self smart")
 - ▼ **Naturalistic Intelligence** ("nature smart")

2. Reggio Emilia

Reggio Emilia considers environment as the third teacher. The aim of the Reggio Approach is to promote children's education through the development of all their languages: expressive, communicative, symbolic, cognitive, ethical, metaphorical, logical, imaginative and relational.

3. Piaget Cognitive Theory

Piaget developed a stage theory of intellectual development that included four distinct stages: the sensory-motor stage, the pre-operational stage, the concrete operational stage, the formal operational stage.

Piaget's Cognitive Theory approach aims at students' cognitive development through sensorial experiences, pretend play, logical thinking and deductive reasoning activities.

4. Montessori Method

The Montessori Method of teaching aims at developing language skills, sensorial skills, maths, cultural subjects & practical life skills.

5. **Integrated Interdisciplinary and ICT based teaching methodology** is followed to give the best of education.

The Goal of our curriculum is to help children become self-confident, independent and inquisitive learner. Our main aim is to develop and nurture GLOCAL LEARNERS by providing the best of global education with local values.



IT INITIATIVES

Keeping in mind the advantages of Technology in Education, the school is always in favour of blending Technology with Education. In the last few years, the school has taken many initiatives in the field of IT Education. The highlights of the same are as follows :

- 1) Each and every class-room of the school is equipped with a Smart Board and teachers use the same as a teaching-aid.
- 2) The class-rooms are equipped with internet facility which can be effectively used by teachers as another teaching-aid in the class-room.
- 3) Since the session 2010-11, the school has started yet another IT initiative in the form of an online portal.
- 4) Some highlights of online portal are as follows :
 - a. Individual user ID and password is provided to each student and parent to log on to the portal.
 - b. The student / parent can contact the class-teacher for user ID and password.
 - c. The school will use portal for all communication (Notice/Circulars) to parent.
 - d. Practice Work / Assignments will also be uploaded in the portal.
 - e. Late admission would be able to access archived assignments.
 - f. Students on-leave would be able to access Practice Work / Assignments given.
 - g. SMS is sent from school to parents as and when required. (Parents are requested to update phone number, if changed).
 - h. Month wise attendance of the students can be viewed from parent's login as well as student's login.
 - i. Updates regarding various News and Events and photographs can be viewed through online portal.
 - j. Parents and students would be able to see the month-wise syllabus for their respective class through their login.
 - k. The progress report of the student for the current academic year and the previous years is available online through parents' and students' login.
- 5) **Please log on to the portal regularly, for updates.**

Initiative during Covid 19 - Online Classes

Introduction of NEP

The academic session 2020- 21 began in accord with the implementation of CBSE norms and guidelines laid down during the prevalent pandemic situation. The introduction of NEP 2020 has broadened the horizon of online teaching.

Experiential Learning

This curriculum and pedagogical adaptation is planned through experiential learning, 21st century skills along with interdisciplinary, competency based explorative activities and amalgamation of the lesson plans have helped to transform virtual learning seamlessly in the classroom and promote academic acumen among students.

Innovative IT Platforms

The current session saw a strikingly innovative concept of teaching learning shifting virtually through Google Meet, Zoom as well as Google classroom. The students are assigned to complete their work and submit it through Google classroom for assessment. Kahoot, Zoom breakout rooms, padlet, jam board, etc are being used to make the teaching-learning process more effective. The virtual teaching is planned as per the age appropriateness for varied classes.

Syllabus and Day to Day Planning

The lesson plans are split into a planner which is uploaded on a daily basis to brief parents about regular teaching-learning as well as homework. For classes VI-VIII, day-wise plan is shared with parents to assist them in supervising their wards regularly. While for Pre Primary to class V the 'Daily Planner' is uploaded on a day-to-day basis to brief parents on regular teaching learning and homework details. For classes IX-XII the study material uploaded supplements the lesson plan to enhance critical thinking.

Initiative during Covid 19 - Online Classes

E- Learning Material

Educators shared online textbooks through school Portal during this lock down to ensure safety for students. The in-house study material, assignments and worksheets, objective type question booklet made by the teachers on the topics covered are regularly uploaded on School Portal. Training sessions were conducted for teachers to make them accustomed to the upcoming virtual classes. To bring about ease in teaching- learning the educators created more than 125+ interesting and intricate videos and power point presentations as well. O-labs are being used for practical for IX-X. Further you-tube videos are made and shared with the students of class XII.

Online Assessments

The assessment of the learners is conducted through Google forms and Exam.net to make the teaching process impactful. The students were initially administered through practice tests of each subject to make them habitual with the new format. Project based assessment is conducted for students along the same lines of virtual classes.

Online Activities

To create equilibrium between academics and co curricular activities, the school has initiated to conduct sessions on dance, music, art and craft, physical exercises, ESD, Sports and HPE also are part of the regular academic schedule. Apart from academics, regular and special assemblies are organized on a virtual platform wherein the entire class participates zealously. Students along with their mentors conducted Webinars on varied current topics which proved to be a turning point in the process of modern day learning. Alongside, the students have also participated in varied virtual Inter School Competitions and brought laurels to the school.

Initiative during Covid 19 - Online Classes

Cyber Safety precautions

- a. Parents are involved in use of social media. Email accounts created below the age of 13 are created with parent ID and guidelines were given to parents for creation of it.
- b. Also, below the age of 13 years, all digital devices and content used by students needs to be under parental guidance and supervision.
- c. School Disciplinary Action Policy is created by School. Offences and action taken are defined against any misconduct or misbehaviour during online classes, online examination or submissions of projects.
- d. Cyber Safety precautions are released for parents, students and teachers in CyberVue360 E-magazine.



SCHOOL RULES

1. A student must carry the school Almanac everyday with the information page filled in completely.
2. If parents wish to meet the teacher, they may do so after seeking prior appointment from the concerned teacher through an almanac note.
3. During school hours, parents and guardians are not allowed to visit either their ward or any teacher. In case of emergency class teacher may be contacted through Front Office.
4. Third language, activities and hobbies once taken, cannot be changed during the academic year.
5. Allocation of sections is done based on boy-girl ratio and second / third language/optional subject.
6. Once the sections are allotted, the school will not entertain any application regarding the change of section of any student.
7. Students leaving the school will receive the report cards on the day of the Open House **only**.
8. Both parents should be present along with the student for open house / PTM meetings held during the year. Results will also be available on the portal. Parent I-card mandatory.
9. Timely fee payment as per due date is imperative. Sufficient balance in the Bank Account needs to be kept to avoid any inconvenience when ACH mandate is run for clearance.
10. Result may be withheld due to non payment of fees.
11. The **Bonafide certificate** will be issued only two days after the submission of the application for the same.
12.
 - a) Only in case of exigencies can a student be picked up from school with permission of the **concerned head**. This is applicable on test days as well.
 - b) In case of an emergency, **only** the parent is allowed to pick up the child. **Parent I-card is mandatory**.
 - c) In case the parents are leaving the town/country, they should make sure that the tickets are scheduled according to the **holiday list and school planner**. Written information about the same to be shared with Class teacher.
 - d) If any long leave is to be taken during a particular term, the same needs to be approved by either the Section Head or the Principal; prior to taking leave .
 - e) In case of any emergency situation / untoward incident, the Date of any assessment as Weekly Test or Examination may get changed. Parents are requested to cooperate for the same.

13. It is mandatory for all students, unless instructed otherwise, to be present for all school functions .
14. The school is committed to protecting the environment and expects students to be environment friendly in all their actions. The use of poly bags (plastic bags) is, therefore, strictly prohibited in the school and students should consciously avoid their use for any purpose.
15. Students are not allowed to wear rings on fingers or nose rings, makeup or expensive jewellery. However, one pair of small (sober) ear/nose studs is permitted.
16. No books (other than text books or library books), magazines, pendrive, CDs, money, mobile phones, camera may be brought to the school without the permission of the Class Teacher.
17. No student shall indulge in any of the following practices:
 - i) Spitting in or near the school building.
 - ii) Disfiguring or damaging any school property.
 - iii) Smoking iv) Any form of gambling
 - v) Rowdy & rude behavior.
 - vi) Use of violence in any form, bullying or anti social behaviour.
 - vii) Casteism, communalism or practice of untouchability .
 - viii) Bursting of crackers.
 - ix) Use of drugs except on prescription by a practitioner/Doctor.
18. No student should damage any school furniture, draw graffiti or in any way damage things belonging to others. Any damage done will be compensated by the one who causes it, or the whole class.
19. A student will be allowed to go on the trip only if he/she has attended school for minimum of 80% for classes VI-XII and 85% for classes I-V of the total working days.
21. Parent / Visitor / Guardian carrying mobile device must deposit the device at the school gate for security / safety reason.
22. The school reserves the right to take action including suspend, rusticate or expel any student who indulges in creating/posting any inappropriate, embarrassing or harmful post on any form of social media which defames any person or member of the staff, student, stakeholder or the organization.
23. Parents are entirely responsible to provide lunch boxes to their wards for the break time which students are required to carry with them to school. The school will play no part in procuring and delivering lunch box or any other personal articles which students have inadvertently forgotten to carry with them, to their classes. Student must ensure that bags are carefully packed according to the time table and all necessary belongings are carried with them to school. No visitors without prior appointment will be entertained during school hours to deliver such items.

TRANSPORT RULES

SHREENATH TRAVELLERS

(Managing Transport Services of Delhi Public School-Bopal, Ahmedabad)

1. Buses operated by Shreenath Travellers endeavors to adhere to the prescribed guidelines and Standard norms for School Transport Service.
2. School does not provide transport facility and the same is available under contract arrangement through Shreenath Travellers. This facility is available to and from the school but there is no guarantee that a seat in the bus will be assured.
3. Students can avail the optional transport facility, subject to availability of seats. Once the transport facility is availed, it will have to be continued till the end of the quarter of the ongoing academic year or as communicated by the contractor from time to time.
4. No private commercial vehicle, auto-rickshaws and contractors (except the contractor recognized by the school) would be allowed in the school.
5. Safety and security of the children being the prime concern, it is emphasized that yellow bus on contract is the safest for students, fitted with speed governors, fire extinguisher, CCTV, First AID, has trained drivers and responsible bus in charges.
6. It will be the responsibility of the parents/guardians to drop/collect the child from the specified bus stop. Child must report at the scheduled stop 5 minutes before the bus arrival time.
7. In case the parent is not present at the pick-up point at the time of dropping the child home, the child would be brought back to school (for classes Prep to II).
8. The address provided in the Transport Office shall remain valid for at least one quarter.
9. Any application for change in the residential address should be submitted **15 days in advance** to the transport office. Subsequently, transport will be provided subject to availability of seats in the bus in that particular route/area in which the bus is plying.
10. No temporary changes or adjustment in transport facility will be entertained.
11. The pick-up point and dropping point of your ward will be decided as per the specified routes and request for extension or change in route will not be accepted.

12. Application for discontinuation of transport facility should be submitted to transport office one **month in advance**.
13. Eating, drinking or playing any game in the bus is strictly forbidden.
14. Under no circumstances are students allowed to go behind or under the parked buses and they are not to touch the instruments panel of buses.
15. Please ensure that, under no circumstances any parent boards the bus to discuss any problem of his/ her child.
16. The bus escort is responsible for maintaining discipline in the buses. Any accident/serious offence must be reported to transport in charge immediately. Under no circumstances shall the parents indulge into any altercation/arguments with the bus driver or the bus escorts. Any case of indiscipline / misbehavior by a parent will be taken seriously and may amount to discontinuance of bus service.
17. Parents who refuse to escort their child to and from the bus stop are solely responsible for any mishap to their child before pick up or after drop by the bus.
18. In case of not seeking the transport facility (opting for self transport), a parent escort card shall be provided to the person authorized to pick-up the student. This card is to be shown at the school gate at the time of picking up the student. This procedure will be followed very strictly. Additional identity card will be provided at an extra cost.
19. In case the parent/guardian who usually picks up the child from pick up/drop point, cannot come to pick their ward for some reason, they must compulsorily inform the concerned class teacher/school teacher/admin in charge) through SMS/phone, if not informed or already informed earlier in writing through the child by a note in the School Almanac where this was known in advance. On approval, they may then authorize someone else to pick their ward who must carry the identity card.
20. In case a student who usually travels by bus is being picked up by the parent/escort/guardian/any authorized person on any day for some reason, this should be done only after due procedure of request for special departure from parent to the Class teacher, and a specific gate out pass signed by the

Class Teacher & Section Head. This gate out pass is required to be given at the gate when the child leaves with the parent/guardian/escort/any authorized person or by the child him/herself (if in Class XI and above).

21. In case of students travelling by private vans hired directly by the parents, the concerned parents may contact Traffic Police directly in case they are concerned about any violation by these private vehicles which may risk the safety of the children.
22. As per CBSE circular dated 23.02.2017, it is advised to the parent that :
 - (a) They are equally responsible for the safety of their children during school journeys.
 - (b) Parents must ensure that mode of transport arranged by the school authorities or by themselves is absolutely safe for their children.
 - (c) Parents should note down the violations committed by the driver and other staff of the bus and immediately report to the concerned authorities on the phone number given on each bus.
 - (d) Parents must avoid using transport services from vehicles not having valid license or RTO permit to carry the school children.
23. Pre-Primary Classes are in Satellite and Bopal Campus. Separate Bus Routes for Pre Primary Classes are applicable as per the Campus/Shift allotted at the time of Admission.
24. Transport facility is liable to get cancelled in case of nonpayment of Transport charges (as applicable) in advance of each quarter as mentioned in the circular
25. The transport services can be discontinued by the Contractor in case a parent/student indulges in any act of misbehavior/indiscipline in the bus.
26. Late payment charges shall be charged @ ₹ 10/- per day in case payment is not made by the due date of each quarter as mentioned in the Transport charges circular. For dishonoured cheque / rejection by Bank, additional payment of ₹ 300/- has to be made.
27. At no point, the school shall be held responsible for any mishap.
28. Please note that the transport office is handling over 5000 students and is not always available to speak to parents. Parents can contact bus teacher in charge.

PAYMENT OF SCHOOL FEES

1. The School Fees is payable quarterly as per the schedule below:

2. Parent must make appropriate arrangement for the remittance of the prescribed and published school fees within due dates without waiting for a reminder from the School. School fee is payable through Online School Portal / ACH (Automated Clearing House).
3. If fees is not paid/remitted within maximum of 30 days of the stipulated date as above, the concerned student's name will be struck off from the school roll. Fresh admission will be required to be sought or else the pending fees will be adjusted against caution money(if any) as a case of non-attendance and the school will entertain no correspondence in this regard.
4. Late fee shall be payable @ ₹ 20/- per day, in case payment is not made by the due dates as above. For dishonoured cheque / rejection by Bank, additional payment of ₹ 300/- has to be made.
5. In case of student proceeding on long leave, full payment of school fees for the session is to be made in advance to the school.
6. In case of admission/withdrawal anytime during the session, the school fees for that particular quarter will be charged/not to be refunded as the case may be. In case of withdrawal, if there are any pending dues, the application for withdrawal will not be processed unless past dues are cleared.
7. School Leaving Certificate/Transfer Certificate will not be issued until all dues of the school are cleared and caution money (if any) will be forfeited / adjusted.
8. It is not mandatory for the school to send reminders for payment of fee.

POINTS TO REMEMBER

ISSUE OF YELLOW CARD

1. Yellow Card is issued to a student by the Principal on account of serious offence like cheating in the examination or test, breaking rules, bunking school, misbehavior with a teacher or with a fellow student, damaging school property etc. It goes in the personal file of the student. The student will be under strict observation.
2. Recommendation for issuing Yellow Card by teacher will be made to the Principal through the Discipline Panel. The counterfoil of the Yellow Card will be filed in the 'Student Record File' after approval by the Principal.
3. In case 3 Yellow cards are issued in the academic year, the authorities may consider taking strict action.
4. Parents of the student would be called to school to sign the Yellow Card issued to the student. They will be required to sign a guarantee of good behavior. If a student does not show any improvement or if he/she repeats his/her mistake, strict disciplinary action will be taken against him/her.

Note:

A student has to get the Yellow Card signed daily by subject teachers, parents and the authorities on the days as mentioned on the Yellow Card.

A student to whom Yellow card has been issued stands disqualified for Pratibha Gaurav awards as well as for field trips and tours

ISSUE OF RED CARD

1. Red Card is issued to a student on account of irregular academic records with respect to assignments, submissions etc. It goes in the personal file of the student. A student on Red card will be under strict observation.
2. Parents of the student would be called to school when a Red Card is issued to the student. They will be required to sign a guarantee of academic improvement. If a student does not show improvement in his/her academics, remedial action would be taken.
3. In case 3 red cards are issued in a year, the authorities will take decision according to the CBSE norms.
4. Recommendation for issuing Red Cards by a teacher will be notified to the Principal through the Academic Coordinator. The counterfoil will be sent directly to the student’s record file after the approval of the Principal.
