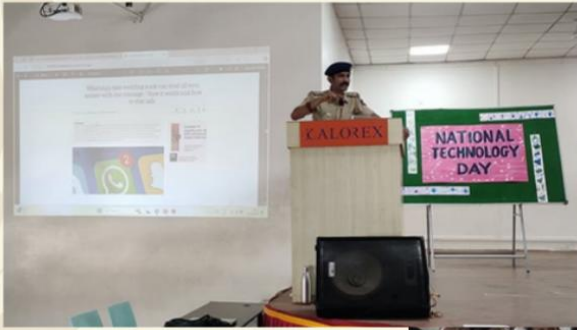

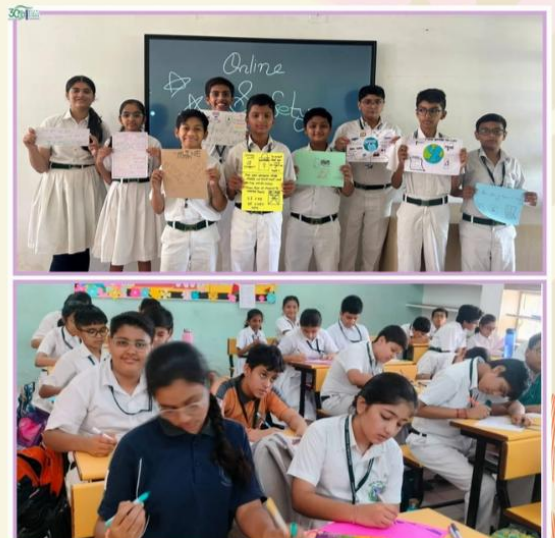
National Technology Day Celebration at Delhi Public School–Bopal

A Creative Workshop in Form and Texture



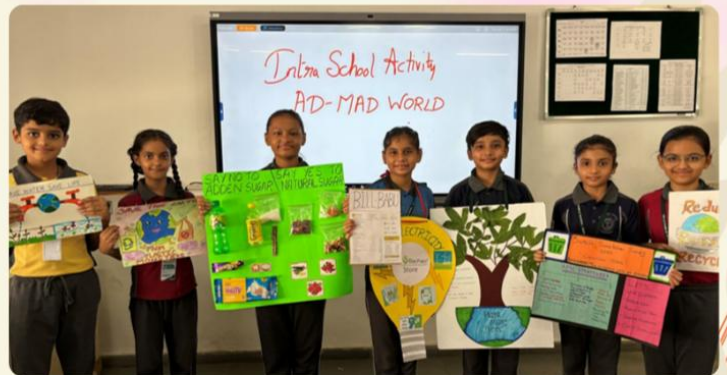

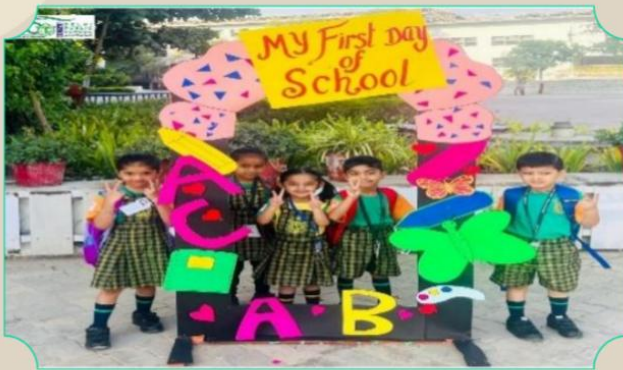
INVESTITURE CEREMONY: SENIOR SCHOOL

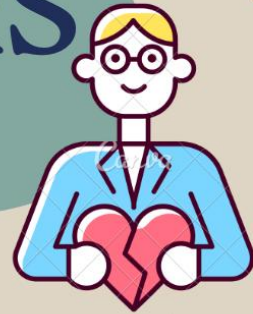

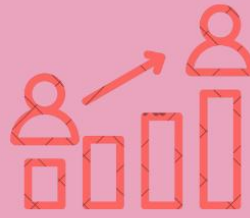
Empowering Young Minds: Workshop on Menstrual Hygiene

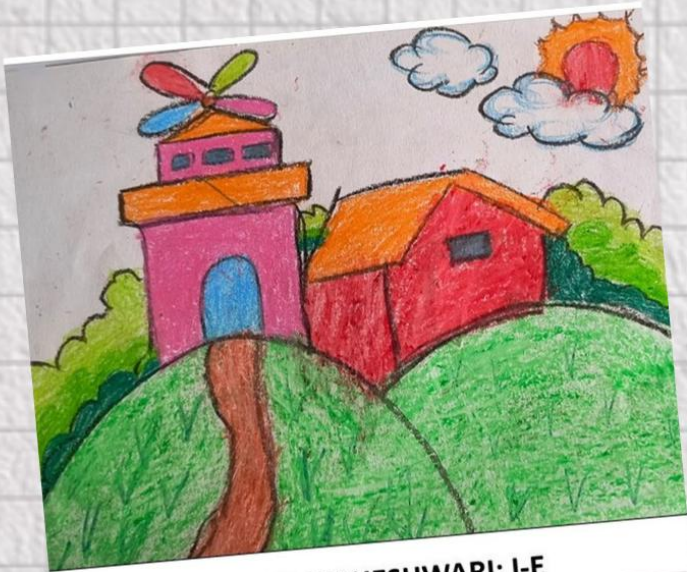


Nurturing Creative and Critical Thinking in Classrooms

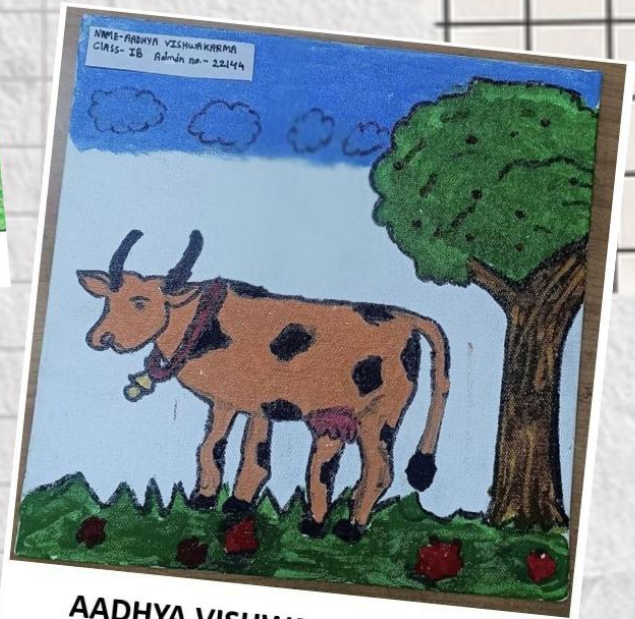

MY SUPER HERO, MY NANAJI

Friends, I have a very interesting story to tell you all. The true story of a real superhero who fought wars to protect our country. His name is Wg Cdr B Ravi Kumar (Retd), and he is my very brave and courageous maternal grandfather. I want to share his story because I hope many young children like you and me will be inspired and encouraged to follow the path of heroism that he led.

My grandfather was a pilot in the Indian Air Force and served 27 glorious years in service to the nation. He was commissioned on 4th June 1967 as a pilot officer; he fought the 1971 war between India and Pakistan. He was a part of both the Eastern and Western Wing in Bombay attached to the Indian Navy and partook in the sinking of PNS GAZA. In the Eastern Wing he was in Agartala very close to Dhaka helping evacuate the Bangladeshis. He has flown a variety of aircrafts starting his flying career with the Dekota, the transport aircraft, followed by helicopters MI-4, MI-18, MI-17, MI-25, MI-26 Gunship in Sri Lanka, the Chetak. During the 1975-76 floods, he flew a number of relief operations for Bihar and Odisha and rescued many stranded inmates from their rooftops.

He has some very fond memories of rescuing a pregnant lady from her rooftop who gave birth to her baby soon after her rescue in his helicopter. He also flew our then Prime Minister Mrs. Indira Gandhi for her tour to all flood affected areas of Bihar specially Patna as Patna was completely submerged under water then. He served in the Intelligence for 5 years while he was posted at Bengaluru. During which he would do the disappearing act every now and then to unknown places and the mystery of his whereabouts are still unknown to us till today.

He was part of the IPKF (the Indian Peace Keeping Force), in Sri Lanka, fighting against the LTTE (Liberation Tigers of Tamil Elam), for almost 9 months becoming one of the longest serving officers in the IPKF. He was awarded with the Presidents commendation medal by the then President Mr. R Venkatraman. While in Sri Lanka he had some very close encounters with the LTTE terrorists, as close as 2 feet from where he was. During his time there, there was very little contact with his family. No news from him meant good news because if news came, we feared if the news was good or bad. After 23 years of flying, he converted to missiles and commanded the Pichorra Missiles Squadron in the 1990s in Assam and Srinagar. The Pichorra Missiles have been a part of the Republic Day Parade for many years. His missiles were moved and positioned on the Indo-Pak border due to the buildup of tension on the possibility of another clash during the Kuwait war. He survived in temperatures many degrees below zero.

Close to his retirement, he trained numerous NCC Cadets and young boys and girls aspiring to join the Defence Forces and today many of them are senior officers in the Armed Forces of India including Coast Guards. He has also trained young boys for Civil Aviation Pilot's license in Patna Bihar. A few years back he had the privilege of flying as a passenger in an Air India Flight which was flown by one of his coached students who came out of the cockpit to meet him as soon as he saw his name in the passenger's list.



Today he is 80 years old and a proud grandfather of 4 grandsons the youngest of which is me, hoping that one of us will make him proud by carrying the baton of joining the armed forces one day. He himself was the son of a Wg Cdr from the technical branch. His family of wife and two daughters one of which is my mother, has spent long durations without seeing him or hearing about his welfare while he was in Sri Lanka and RAW. During those times my Grandmother Mrs. Vineeta Ravi Kumar handled the education of both her daughters, one of which is my mother, very courageously all by herself. She has stood by him throughout his service to the nation. They began their journey by being pen friends that later led to 54 years of marital bliss. It gives me great honour to talk about my grandfather's life of valor and selfless service to the nation. As you all read my grandfather's story, I hope it will inspire you to one day join the Defence services and serve our country when you grow up. Thank you and JAI HIND

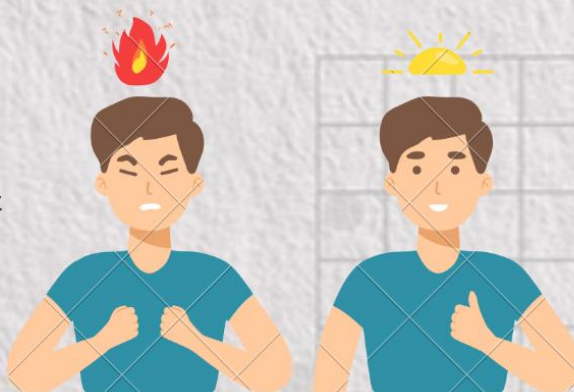

Beyond Exams: How Competencies Shape Careers

Success in the real world doesn't depend on what you know, but on what you can do with what you know. Contrary to what is the norm in most schools, the highest marks probably do not get the loudest applause. This is something I learnt fairly recently while applying to schools for the last two years of my schooling. I distinctly remember feeling more than sure of myself when I walked into the interview room because I had a respectable report card with perfect scores in the necessary subjects and a decent overall percentage only brought down by the two subjects that were not only not of my liking, but also not at all important for my stream.

So to say that the interview process shocked me would be an understatement. Because the interviewer did not ask me a single question from the textbook. What she did ask me was about the competency and skills I brought to the table. And in that moment, I had nothing to say to her. There was once a time when I was known for being a jack of all trades. From instruments, music and dance, both Indian and western, to all kinds of sports, reading, writing and even a few academic extra-curricular activities. You name it and I had learnt it. But then slowly and gradually juggling studies and school work with all of these activities became more and more difficult and hobbies took the back seat. And before I even realized it, I had completely stopped working on developing non-academic skills.

For the longest time, we had been told time and again that the course of our student lives depended on how well we scored in the board exams. So going to school and giving exams was never just about learning, it was about preparing for the boards. Fifth grade wasn't just fifth grade; it was the base year for all that was to come in the higher grades. Sixth grade wasn't just sixth grade; it was the year we had to start taking things more seriously because board exams were only four years away now. Then three years, then two years, then one, until the day they finally start. The month of board exams is no less stressful than if it were a war, for both the student and his/her family. But what happens when they finally get over? When you spend such a big part of your life preparing for one single event, a sense of cluelessness prevails once it finally ends. Because what now? It's not like any thought, time, energy or effort was put into visualizing any other goals. And that is when I actually realized just how little I knew outside of what I had studied. Yes of course exams matter to an extent, but are they really so important that we make them the primary focus and center of our lives? At the end of the day, mugging up your economics textbook isn't going to help you manage the finances of your company. Writing a 150-word essay isn't going to give you the guts to stand in front of a 150 people and present your point.

Learning about the life cycle of great leaders isn't going to make you one. But leading a group project can, even if the project ends up getting no more than three marks out of five. We live in a time where the combination of ambition and pressure has produced students who are all equally capable of scoring above ninety or even ninety-five percentages in the board exams. In fact, scoring ninety-five would probably not earn you a spot in even the top 20. So in such a day and age where everyone is equally competent academically, what can you do to set yourself apart from the rest? It is to develop soft skills. Leadership, communication, teamwork, collaboration, empathy, critical thinking. Skills that cannot be measured by marks or a three-hour exam that expects you to have the contents of your entire textbook on the tip of your tongue.

Anybody can write a short note on why teamwork makes the dream work, but not everybody can actually manage to collaborate and work in a team. This is where your competencies come in to save the day. Because if you have spent a good amount of time gaining practical knowledge, you are already two steps ahead of people who only focused on exam centric theoretical knowledge. Doing even a five-hour internship can teach you a lot more than a ten-hour study session can. Marks matter only for a fleeting amount of time. Ten years down the lane, nobody is going to remember what you scored in your tenth grade exams. But they will remember how efficiently you managed a crisis at school or work.

However, at the same time, completely disregarding marks would not work either. You do need a certain level of grades to even consider applying to some of the best colleges of not only the world, but also of India. The key is to maintain a healthy balance. If you have thirty hours of free time every week, don't spend all thirty on just studying or just hobbies and skills. Invest a few hours on school work, a few on gaining experience and developing competency, and also spend a few on things that are not necessarily productive but that you enjoy.

Theoretical knowledge, competency, and personal satisfaction all share the same level of importance in a successful as well as fulfilling life. Because ultimately, as soon as the years of education end, marks will cease to matter and other factors will come into play. At that point, it would make a person's life a lot easier if she/he had already spent a good amount of time and efforts into honing other areas like critical thinking, adaptability, communication skills, deductive skills and other competencies. These competencies may not help you ace an exam, but they will definitely shape your careers.
