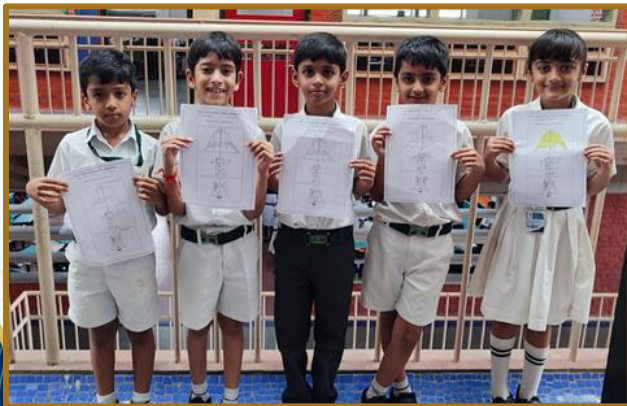
COOKING THEIR WAY TO CREATIVITY: GRADES III AND V

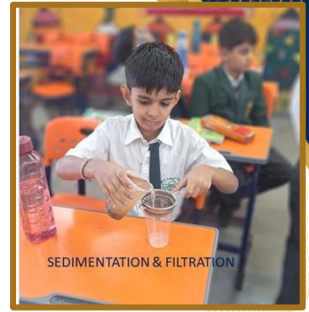
FOOD MELA: GRADE III

LITERARY FEST ACTIVITIES: GRADE III

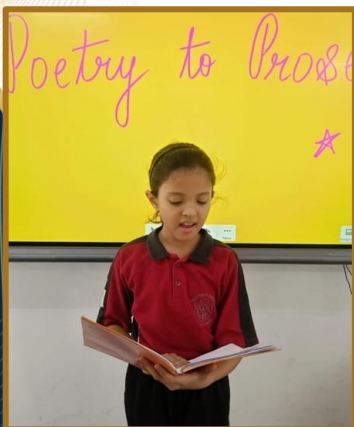

KALOREX LITERARY FESTIVAL ACTIVITIES: GRADE III

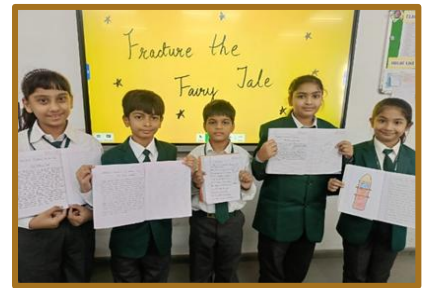

STORY COMES ALIVE: GRADES I & II

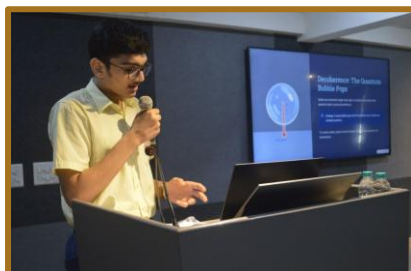

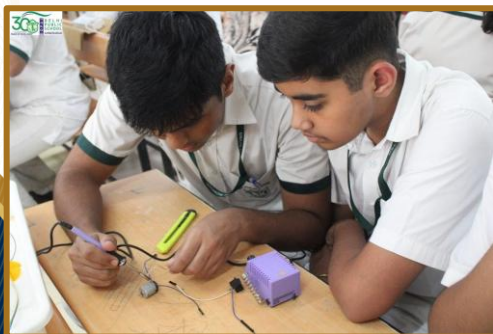

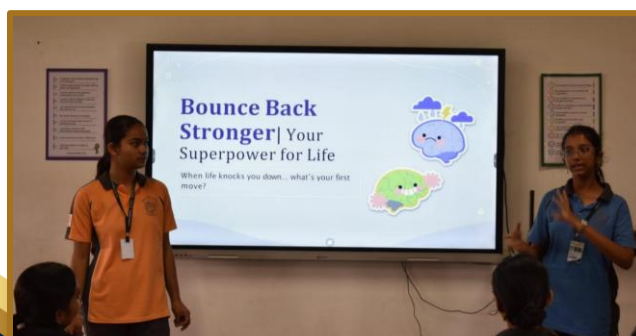


STUDENT LED PEER EDUCATOR PROGRAM SESSIONS ON RESILIENCE

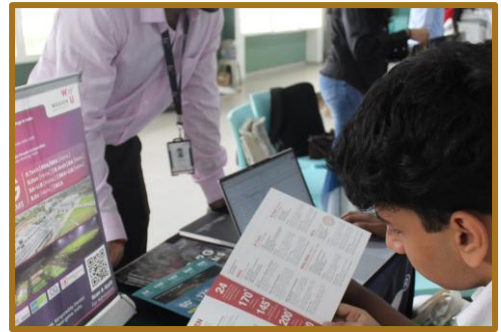

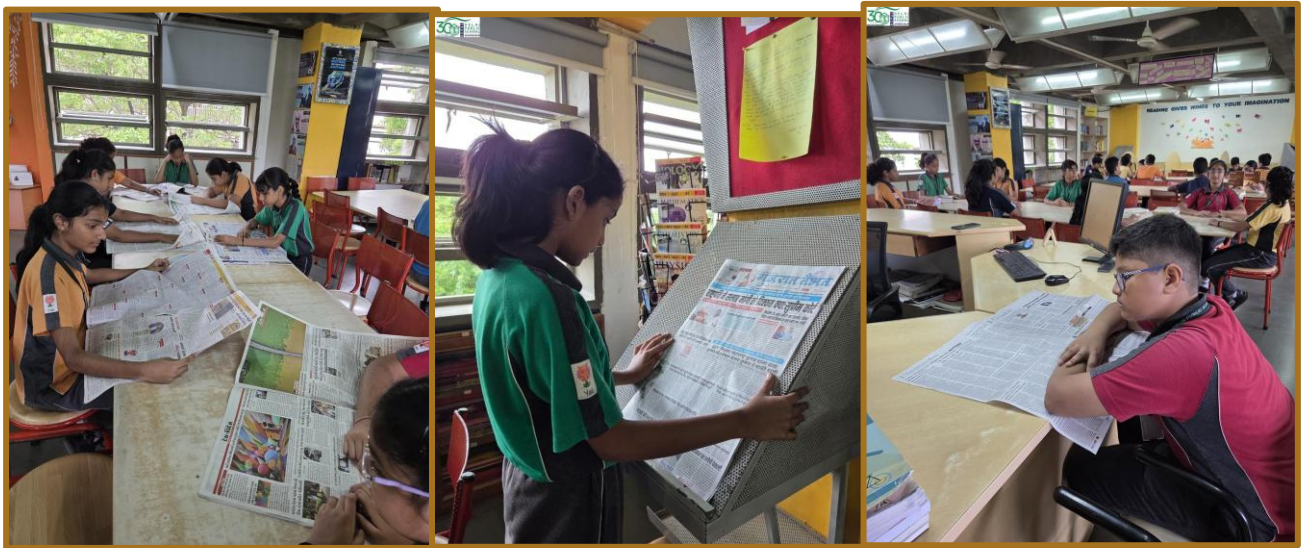
EUREKA SCIENCE EXHIBITION 2025

BEYOND CHECK-INS AND SMILES: MASTERING THE SOFT SKILLS OF HOSPITALITY

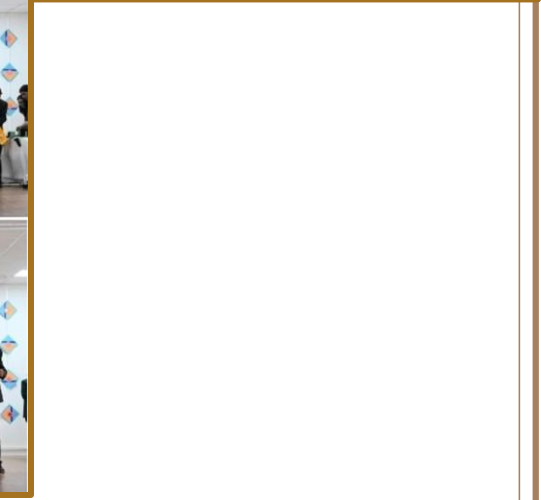

EVERY DROP COUNTS: A NUKKAD NATAK ON WATER CONSERVATION

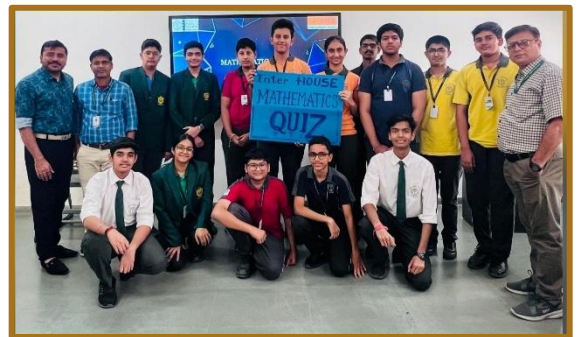

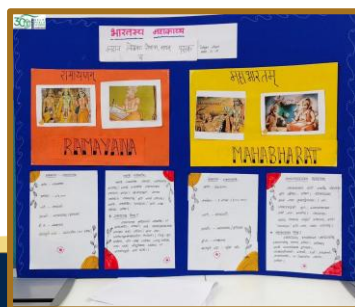
HINDI ACTIVITIES FOR KALOREX LITERARY FESTIVAL 2025

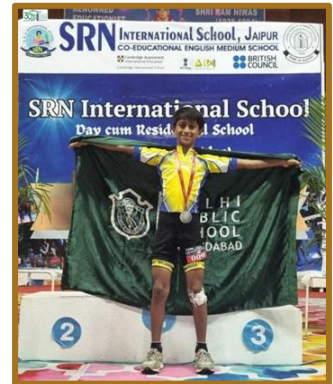

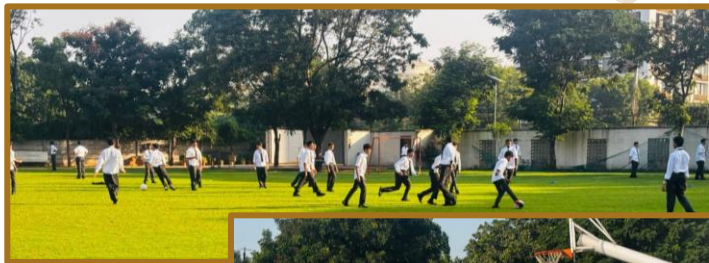
MAKING WAVES AT THE STATE LEVEL

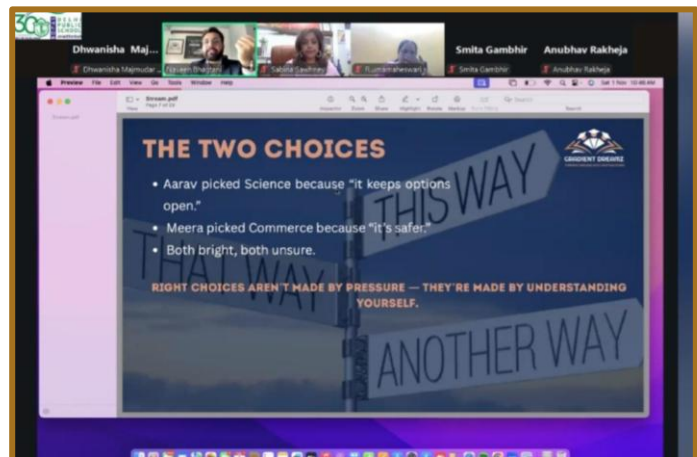
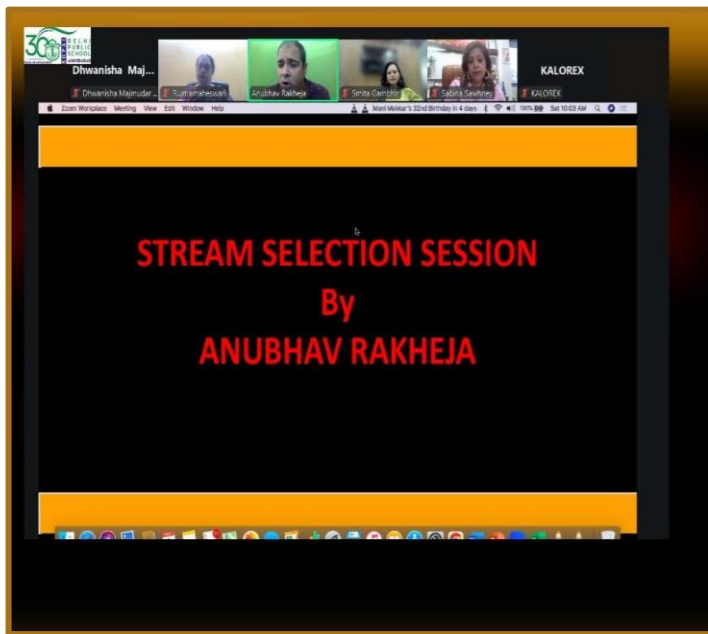
NURTURING MINDS, BUILDING BALANCE

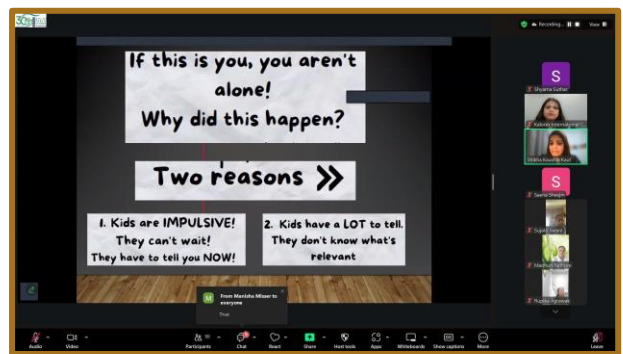
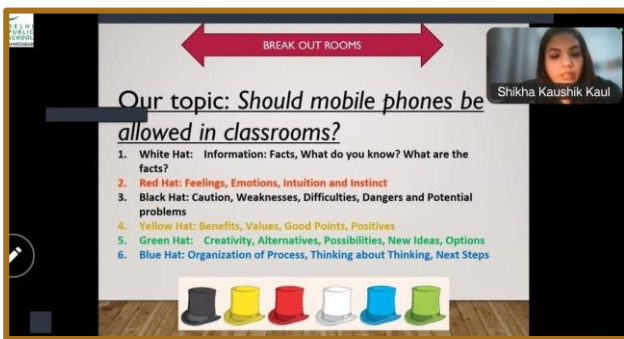
STRENGTHENING SCHOOL-PARENT PARTNERSHIPS FOR HOLISTIC GROWTH

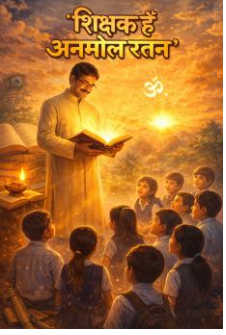

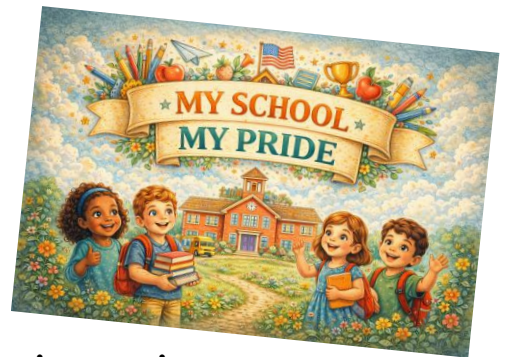

Showing falsified hopes and delusions to young authors and avoiding their objections is absolutely dreadful. For students and young achievers, it almost feels like an embellishment.

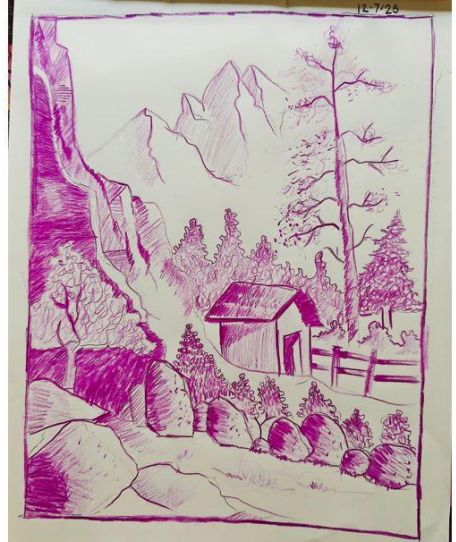
